

Current Wiki Setup

Hosting

Currently using a free-tier AWS EC2 instance with the following parameters:

- Instance type: t2.micro
 - vCPUs: 1
 - RAM: 1024MiB
- Region: us-west-1
- OS: Ubuntu 18.04 LTS
- Storage: EBS 30GiB gp2 SSD

Protip: save the `.pem` file into `.ssh` and make an alias in `.zshrc` to quickly connect to the EC2 instance, as such:

alias dokuconnect="ssh -i ~/.ssh/<your key>.pem <username>@<ec2 instance>.compute.amazonaws.com"
```

Domains

All hosted on Namecheap since it's cheaper than Route53.

1. `wiki.smirnov.nyc`, set up A record to point here
2. `sergey.wiki`, set up CNAME and A record

Software

NGINX

Stored the following config in `sites-available` and symlinked in `sites-enabled`:

S3 Backup

Initial setup

1. Create S3 bucket with unique name
2. Write down Access Key ID and Secret Access Key from your user page on AWS
3. Install AWS CLI on the EC2 instance
4. Install Python 3 and PIP3
5. Run `aws configure` and enter in your keys and region

Python3 script

Install `pip3` `install boto3`, then modify the following file to your needs:

import datetime
import os
import re
import tarfile

WIKI_PATH = "/var/www/dokuwiki"
BACKUP_PATH = "~/backups"
```

AWS_ACCESS_KEY = "your_access_key_here"

BUCKET_NAME = "your-bucket-name-here"
BUCKET_KEY_PREFIX = "dokuwiki/"

TARGET_DIRS = ['conf', 'data/attic', 'data/media', 'data/meta',
               'data/pages']
dirs = [WIKI_PATH + '/' + d for d in TARGET_DIRS]

datestring = re.sub('[^0-9]', '', datetime.datetime.now().isoformat())
filename = '{}/wiki-{}.tar.gz'.format(BACKUP_PATH, datestring)
with tarfile.open(os.path.expanduser(filename), 'w:gz') as tar:
    for dir in dirs:
        tar.add(dir, arcname=os.path.basename(dir))

s3 = boto3.resource('s3')
bucket = s3.Bucket(BUCKET_NAME)

try:
    s3.Object(BUCKET_NAME, BUCKET_KEY_PREFIX +
os.path.basename(filename)).put(Body=open(os.path.expanduser(filename),
'rb'))
except botocore.exceptions.ClientError as e:
    error_code = int(e.response['Error']['Code'])
    print(error_code)
```

Cron job

Scheduled to run daily at 10:00 UTC using crontab.

Run `crontab -e` and add the following line:

```
0 10 * * * python3 ~/scripts/s3-backup.py
```
